

# PROJECT “PROMOTING INDUSTRY LINKAGES WITH VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (AUS4SKILLS VET)”



Aus4Skills VET is a component of Aus4Skills, a ten-year partnership (2016-2025) between Australia and Vietnam to build the human resource capacity of Vietnam.

**Aus4Skills VET Phase 2** was approved under Decision No. 1297/QĐ - dated 19/11/2021 of the Minister of Labor, Invalids and Social Affairs (MOLISA), a continuation of Phase 1 implemented during 2017-2021

**Project owner:** Directorate of Vocational Education and Training (DVET), MOLISA

**Donor:** Australian Government

**Implementation period:** 2021 –2025

**Objective:** To contribute to vocational education and training (VET) policy refinement through the application of a sustainable and replicable, high quality, inclusive, industry-led skills development model that equips VET graduates with the competencies for working in the logistics and allied sectors.

**16 partner colleges** include seven colleges in HCM City, two in Dong Nai, two in Da Nang, and one each in Long An, Thua Thien Hue, Ha Noi, Hai Phong, and Dien Bien.

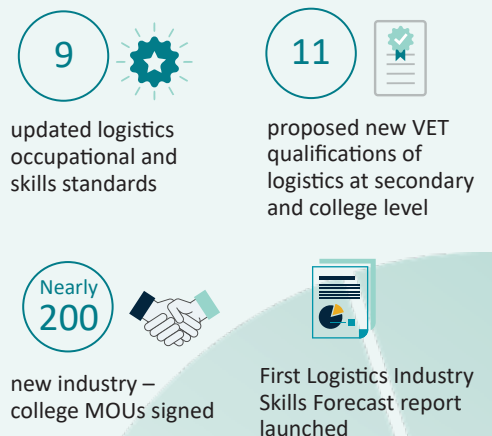
The project supports implementation of Vietnam’s vocational education development strategy 2021 – 2030, vision to 2045 and also its action plan to improve competitiveness capacity and develop Vietnam's logistics services to 2025.

## TARGETED PROJECT OUTCOMES

- The pilot Logistics Industry Reference Council (LIRC) is established and implements its activities effectively and sustainably
- Targeted VET colleges and enterprises deliver logistic training based on the knowledge and requirements that learners need to acquire after graduation
- Targeted VET colleges and enterprises implement education quality frameworks for skills development in the logistics and allied sectors
- Targeted VET colleges and enterprises promote inclusive skills development and employment in the logistics and allied sectors

Government, enterprises and VET colleges cooperating under a proactive and inclusive mechanism for skills development, through the Logistics Industry Reference Council (LIRC). This new model is replicable for other sectors and heading towards sustainability.
