- ★ LIRC's participation in the first Vietnam International Logistics Exhibition with a counter to support VET colleges and industry linkages


Successful delivery of the VET International Forum on 24 October 2023 in Hanoi, focused on "Upskilling the logistics workforce and promoting industry linkages in the digital era", and attended by 250 participants, including the Australian Ambassador and the Ministry of Labour, Invalids and Social Affairs Vice Minister. The forum created great media coverage and was Vietnam's biggest event in VET in 2023.





Surge in knowledge exchange activities at the request of Directorate of Vocational Education and Training (DVET), especially:

- Shared reports with DVET on Australia's reforms and sector skills councils, training packages, and a review of Vietnam's LIRC model.
- Shared knowledge with DVET about curricum development and quality assurance standards.
- Supported DVET to co-organise a workshop on "Sharing experience on entrepreneurship, vocational training and employment for the elderly" in
- Developed a report on VET permeability/articulation, in response to a request by the National Assembly Committee on Culture - Education, which was presented at a workshop on 22 December 2023

2023 IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS IN NUMBERS



403 participants in relevant short courses and other activities (training and field visits) to strengthen LIRC (Female: 204; People with disabilities: 21, Rural Disadvantaged: 36)

386 participants in short courses and other activities to support targeted VET colleges and enterprises (Female: 193; People with disabilities: 14, Rural Disadvantaged: 49)

2,352 newly recruited VET students studying logistics or logistics-related qualifications in 16 partner colleges (Female: 1,314; People with disabilities: 2)

 $65\,\mathrm{curriculum/modules}$ adapted to incorporate appropriate new Occupational Standards or Occupational Skills Standards

48 Memoranda of Understanding signed between VET colleges and business associations or enterprises

47 quality assurance initiatives implemented by partner colleges

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100% of surveyed participants of four VET short courses organised in 2023 were satisfied with their course quality, among them, 97 % reported application of newly acquired knowledge and skills in their professional activities and life.
