### **State Initiatives**



### **TAFE New South Wales**

- Career Pathways: Programs designed to help transition into new career paths, particularly useful for older adults looking to re-enter the workforce or change careers.
- Short Courses: Covering a wide range of topics from technology to creative arts, tailored to various skill levels.
- **Digital Literacy**: Specific courses aimed at improving digital skills, including internet safety and basic computer applications.
- Business and Finance: Courses that cover small business management, marketing, and finance.
- **Health and Wellbeing**: Programs that focus on personal health, nutrition, and wellness, often relevant for an older demographic.
- **Community Services**: Courses in areas like counselling, mental health, and aged care services.
- **Skills Recognition Programs**: Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) programs that can help older adults leverage their life and work experience for formal qualifications.

### **NSW Government Financial Initiatives**

- **Smart and Skilled Program**: This New South Wales program provides financial support for students enrolling in approved courses, including older Australians.
- **Fee-Free Scholarships**: For eligible students, including disadvantaged groups, the NSW government offers scholarships that cover the student fee.
- <u>Tech Savvy Seniors</u>: This initiative is a partnership between the NSW Government and Telstra, offering free or low-cost digital literacy training for seniors.

### **State Initiatives**



### **TAFE Victoria**

- Adult Education: Includes literacy and numeracy courses, often appealing to lifelong learners including the elderly.
- Digital Literacy: Courses designed to improve skills in using computers, smartphones, and the internet.
- **Creative Arts**: Courses in areas like painting, drawing, photography, and crafts.
- **Hospitality**: Short courses in food and beverage preparation, a popular choice for many older adults interested in culinary arts.
- Healthcare and Community Services: Specialized courses in areas like aged care, mental health, and disability services.
- Business and Finance: Covering topics such as bookkeeping, small business management, and investment.
- **Flexible Learning Options**: Many courses have part-time, evening, and online options to accommodate different schedules and needs.

### **Victorian Government Financial Initiatives**

- **Skills First Program**: The Victorian Government's Skills First Program subsidizes the cost of training for eligible students in courses that lead to priority occupations. Older adults looking to re-enter the workforce can benefit from this.
- **Retraining or Reskilling**: Special programs or subsidies are available for older workers who have been retrenched to help them retrain or reskill.
- Free TAFE for Priority Courses: In Victoria, certain TAFE courses are made free for eligible students, including those looking to change careers, which includes older adults.

### **State Initiatives**



### **TAFE Queensland**

- **Short Courses**: Offered in a wide range of subjects including digital literacy, culinary arts, and basic accounting, tailored to various skill levels.
- **Skill Sets**: Focused packages that teach a specific set of skills, such as customer service or basic computer skills.
- Online Learning: A variety of online courses allowing for more flexible learning, useful for those who may have mobility or scheduling issues.
- Health and Community Services: Courses in aged care, disability support, and community services, which may be relevant for older adults interested in these sectors either for employment or volunteer work.
- **Business Courses**: Offerings in small business management and finance that may appeal to older entrepreneurs.
- **Community Outreach**: Partnerships with community organizations that may offer workshops and short courses in community centres, which can be accessible to older adults.

### **Queensland Government Financial Initiatives**

- **Skilling Queenslanders for Work**: While not exclusive to older adults, this initiative provides training to people who are underemployed or require skills development, and older Australians can benefit from this program.
- VET Student Loans: Older Australians looking for diploma-level vocational education and training could be eligible for VET Student Loans to assist with tuition costs.

# **Australian Government Initiatives**

### 1. Skills Checkpoint for Older Workers

- aged 40 years or over
- an Australian citizen or permanent resident
- employed and at risk of becoming unemployed and entering the income support system
- recently unemployed (within 12 months)
- incentive provides up to \$2,200 (GST inclusive) to jointly fund training to help individuals build skills to remain in the workforce longer

### 2. Entrepreneurship Facilitator Program

- to support and encourage entrepreneurship and small business growth in Australia
- focus on assisting older Australians (those aged 45 and above)
- facilitators provided tailored advice and were appointed in specific areas around Australia to offer free advice and mentoring to help people start and run their own business

## Australian Government Initiatives



### 3. Restart Wage Subsidy

- a financial incentive of up to \$10,000
- available to qualifying businesses that employ eligible jobseekers who are 50 years of age or older

- information for job seekers over 45
- benefits of employing mature age workers
- employing mature age workers
- undertaking mature age research
- training for employers on employing mature age workers
